Human beings who have the same position before Allah as caliphs and at the same time as His servants will not be able to experience happiness and inner peace unless their material and spiritual needs have been fulfilled (Arifin, 2012)12. The main aim of the shari'ah according to Imam Ghazali is to maintain human welfare which includes protecting their faith, life, reason, offspring and property. Anything that guarantees the protection of these five things is a benefit for humans and is desirable (Chapra, 2000)13. Imam Ghazali very wisely placed faith at the first place in the list of objectives of the Shari'ah, because from an Islamic perspective, faith is a content that is very important for human happiness. Faith is what puts human relations on the right foundation, which allows humans to interact with each other in a balanced and mutually beneficial relationship in achieving mutual happiness. Imam Ghazali put property last because wealth is not an end in itself.

It is an intermediary tool, although a very important one, for the realization of human happiness. Property cannot deliver this goal unless it is allocated and distributed evenly. This requires the inclusion of certain moral criteria in the enjoyment of property, market operations and so on. If property becomes an end in itself, it will result in inequality, imbalance and environmental destruction which will ultimately reduce the happiness of members of society in the present and for future generations. The three goals in the middle, namely life, reason, and offspring, relate to humans themselves and their happiness is the main goal of the Shari'ah.

Everything necessary to enrich these three goals for all humanity must be considered a necessity. And fulfilling these needs will ensure that the present and future generations are in peace, comfort, and are able to contribute well to the realization and longevity of falah and the life of thayyibah. Any allocation and distribution of resources that does not help realize falah and hayatan thayyibah, according to Ibnu Qayyim, does not reflect wisdom and is not considered efficient and equitable (fair) (Chapra, 2000)14. To carry out these obligations, rulers and entrepreneurs must carry out good and healthy management. Good management must fulfill

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conditions that cannot be ignored in order to achieve good task results. Therefore, rulers and entrepreneurs are obliged to study management science. Especially if the management principles or techniques are found or hinted at in the Koran and Hadith (Arifin, 2012)15. Several principles or rules and management techniques that are relevant to the Qur'an and Hadith include the following: (1) Amar Ma'ruf Nahi Munkar Principles; (2) The obligation to uphold the truth; (3) Obligation to uphold justice; (4) Obligation to convey the mandate (Effendy, 2003)16.

2.2 Management Based on QS. Al Ahzab /33:19 and QS. Yunus/10:3:31

Surah Al-Ahzab and Surah Yunus are one of the surahs in the Koran which contain various teachings and guidelines, including in the context of management. Surah Al-Ahzab verse 19 and Surah Yunus verses 3 and 31 of the Al-Quran are verses that contain messages from Allah SWT that reflect wisdom and important principles that can be applied in management in an Islamic context. This verse contains messages that are relevant for leaders and managers in various fields.

2.3 Management principles based on QS. AL Ahzab/33:19

Verse 19 of Surah Al-Ahzab reads as follows:

means "they are stingy towards you. When fear (danger) comes, you see them looking at you with upturned eyes like someone who is fainting because they are about to die, and when the fear has disappeared, they curse at you with a sharp tongue, while they are stingy to do good. Those who do not believe, then Allah erases their deeds. And that is easy for Allah. 17" (Quran 33:19) This verse can be interpreted as a management principle in Islam which underlines the following things:

1 Ease of Management

This verse illustrates that Allah wants ease in life and management, not difficulty. This principle can be applied in organizational management, where managers and leaders must strive to create an environment that makes things easier for team members and reduces unnecessary obstacles.

2 Welfare and Spaciousness

Paragraphit also reflects the importance of well-being and spaciousness in management. The leader or manager must ensure that team members feel safe, comfortable, and not under too much pressure. This includes providing adequate facilities, rewards and psychological support.

3 Gentleness and Consideration

Meaning: "Say, 'Who gives you sustenance from the heavens and the earth? So say, 'Why do you not fear (Him)? 19"' (Quran 10:31). This verse contains various principles and values that can be applied in management based on Islamic principles:
